# Inequalities and Redistribution in Central and Eastern Europe

Date: July 6–8, 2020

We invite scholars from economics and cognate disciplines to submit extended abstracts or full papers. Topics include, but are not limited to

- Redistributive effects of fiscal, labour market and social policies
- Social exclusion, poverty and inequality: concepts and measurement
- Income mobility, life-cycle dynamics and intergenerational transmission of welfare
- Perceptions of inequality and demand for redistribution

Preference will be given to papers focusing on Central and Eastern Europe and the former Soviet Union.

Accepted participants will be notified by April 20, 2020. Full accepted papers are expected by May 20, 2020.

The workshop language is English. The Hans Raupach Award will honor the author(s) of a paper of exceptional merit.
